 - The point system allows representatives to accumulate engagement points for active
 participation in USG activities. Points are earned for attending general body meetings
 (GBMs), participating in or hosting USG events, and volunteering at tabling events. Each
 activity is worth one point, and representatives will submit their weekly participation
 records via a form sent to both directors and representatives.
 - Honorary Engagement Points- Representatives working on long-term initiatives, such
 as administrative meetings or committee-specific activities, can earn honorary
 engagement points. Honorary points are granted based on director discretion, recognizing
 involvement that doesn't immediately show up in events. Directors and executive board
 members can submit honorary points for representatives, with the form included in
 weekly emails.

- <u>COS Progri</u>- Not a question but if Quinn and Nathan wants to share there experience, they can because they both won.
- <u>Student Trustee Basta</u>- I was a representative and the Deputy of the Treasury Committee
 as a freshman. I earned a lot of points since my name was on a lot of resolutions because
 all resolutions pass through Treasury. It was a valuable experience because it forced me
 to get my hands dirty. It was also healthy competition—back then, there was prize money
 on the table. I'd encourage you all to go for it!
